In addition, we will be posting the draft State application to the U.S. Department of Education on this web page on Monday, May 3, 2010. We will post a final draft later in the week, after it has been peer reviewed by a group of about 10 individuals in varied roles who volunteered to read through the application.

I am gratified by the support our application has received in our meetings around the state and in our video conferences. We have made considerable changes to the application based on the feedback we have received.

The Race to the Top application process is an incredible opportunity for Maine and all of Maine's school systems. Not only can we pursue significant additional funding for education in Maine, but we will also be able to: solidify a cohesive direction for Maine at a critical juncture; support the transformational work already taking place in many of our schools; and transition to a new education era in both Washington, D.C., and in Maine.

It is a requirement for participation in Maine's RTTT application that the MOU and Scope of Work be signed by the superintendent. We strongly encourage you to seek the signatures of the school board chair and association president, as well, as having all three will make a significant difference in the implementation of the plan and in the scoring of our application by the U.S. Department of Education.

It is important that we show the U.S. Department of Education in our application that we have strong interest and willingness to work toward education reforms that benefit our students.

Please note that SAUs wishing to participate in Maine's Race to the Top application must submit a signed MOU and Scope of Work to the Department by May 14, 2010. There is no option to join subsequently.
